

Year 3, 4, 5 and 6 Relationships and Sex Education.

During the last two weeks of half term (Monday 17th to Friday 28th May), the children in Year 3/4, Year 4/5 and Year 6 will be exploring Relationships and Sex Education as part of their Science and PSHE learning. All of the content to be delivered is in line with the Science curriculum, and the new 2020/21 PSHE/RSE framework for primary schools.

Over the course of a number of sessions, the children explore:

- Puberty, hygiene and human development.
- Sexual intercourse and human reproduction.
- Love and relationships.

<u>Sunnyside Garden</u>

I have been very busy again this week in the garden, planting out the peas in two rows and giving them sticks to cling to as they grow. The sweet peas have also been planted out around a tall cane structure. I expect them to grow to the top of the canes and produce lots of sweet smelling flowers the summer. Most of my sweet pea plants have been planted in Alford Manor House garden where they will grow on sticks, in a sunny spot against the side of the barn.

The sweet peas will need lots of regular watering. I check all my greenhouse plants each day to see whether to water them. If the pots or trays feel light, I put them in a tray of water until the compost is moist again.

In the greenhouse I have planted courgettes, butternut squash and runner beans. In the garden I have sown rows of parsnips, carrot and wallflower seeds. I have protected them by putting sticks near them. I do not want the badger who visits the garden every night to dig them up. He has already dug a deep hole in the flower border. I wonder why?
