Football is the world's most popular sport, so it's hardly surprising that a consistently slick and realistic football simulation has become the world's best-selling sports video game. FIFA 21, the latest incarnation in the perennially popular franchise, has been another runaway success – even though critics have noted that changes from FIFA 20 are cosmetic and minor.

While the game's loyal fans (millions of whom are children) continue to go wild for FIFA, many parents and carers do have some reservations. The game offers unmoderated audio chat, for example, while FIFA's variety and playability can make it addictive, and the in-game FUT packs – which function much the same way as loot boxes – can not only be expensive but could also promote gambling.

Every three months, we listen to your concerns and look all recent crime statistics to shape the things we will concentrate on for the next three months. Our priority(s) for the next quarter is:

- Fatal Four
- ASB in priority areas
- Off road bikes/guads

FATAL FOUR Throughout the whole country, speeding is predominately a real issue for all communities. Lincolnshire Police understand this is a priority for most people, and so we will continue to carry out 'fatal four' days of action, tackling issues around not only speeding, but also use of mobile phone, seatbelts and drink/drug driving.

ASB IN PRIORITY AREAS ASE continues to numble on in pockets of the community. We have conducted both high visibility patrols and plain clothes patrols at varying times. Will continue to be pro active and robust in our approach to tackling this kind of unacceptable behaviour.

OFF ROAD BIKES/QUAD BIKES etc...Our aim is to work as a learn, calling on resources from other areas if required to reduce the number of reported off road vehicles which are currently using the highway. This will take background work, tapping into our intelligence base as well as responding to incidents as they occur. Thinking about booking a holiday this year? So Don't let a criminal defraud you of a welfdeserved break and your hard-earned cash. Findout more on how to spot the signs of <u>#HolidayFraud</u>. It could protect you and your money.



As lockdown measures continue to ease, we are launching a campaign to encourage residents and visitors to download the What3words app for free.

If you have the app installed it will allow you to provide an exact location to emergency services, helping us to find you quicker and potentially saving lives.

What3words grids the Earth into 3 metre x 3 metre squares to give each square a unique set of three words: a what3words address. For example, ///habit.user.unstated is the what3words address for an exact spot along the promenade of Skegness Beach.

This app has helped us locate rural collisions as well as missing people on the coast. It is also vital for those in staying in holiday homes, campsites and caravan parks where many places don't have an address.
