

Dear Families,

I am aware that some of our children (and parents) are disappointed about a few things like changes to Sports Day, arrangements for September 2021 and a lack of face to face transition meetings at new schools. Helping children deal with disappointment and worry is painful and as adults, our first impulse is to try and fix the situation and find a solution to make it right for the child.

Equipping children with the tools to cope with disappointment and change makes them more resilient and better able to manage the unpredictability of life.

Children, especially younger ones, don't have the perspective adults have as a result of having lived through our share of disappointments. Instead, children may see things in black and white.

Validating their disappointments is a good place to start, especially during these unprecedented circumstances. Avoid false reassurances — you don't want to give your child unrealistic ideas about what you can promise them.

You might share your own past experiences of change and uncertainty, including how you dealt with those challenges and what the results were.

And as we know, disappointment does not last forever and very often the silver lining behind the dark clouds creates a better outcome.

So, our sincere apologies for any disappointment caused by the decisions made in school but they are always carefully thought through with the safety, security and best interests of the children in mind.

Uniform shop open Wednesdays 9am to 4pm or you can drop your uniform off at our school office and we will take down.





Sunnyside Garden

I have just been for a walk around the garden to take some photographs for you to see this week. I found lots of lovely surprises. The strawberries are very large and beginning to turn red so that I can pick them.

The pea pods are also beginning to fatten up telling me that the peas inside will be developing, so I think I will be able to find enough for a meal this week. Similarly the broad beans are also growing quickly now. I will start to test them to see if they are ready for harvesting. The beans inside the pods need to be large enough to eat. I usually pick all the broad beans that are ready and freeze them for later in the year. I like the beans to be young and not old and large, as the smaller ones taste nicer.

The gooseberries are also beginning to ripen. My variety begins to turn red and then I know they are ready to pick. I freeze the gooseberries, but also make some into chutney and jam.

Clicking on the link within the email, takes you to a convincing but **fake** NHS website that asks for **personal** and **payment details**. (for an admin fee)

The website has since been taken down, but in case similar emails/websites appear can you please circulate the attached alert to your residents, members, groups and mailing lists.

And just to reiterate, your vaccination status is obtained FREE through the NHS App, website or by calling the NHS on 119.
