Sunnyside Garden

This week I have prepared my strawberry plants for winter by hand weeding carefully between each plant. Then I have covered them with a mulch to help the soil improve and stop more weeds from growing.

The mulch was made up of leaves that have been rotting down for a year and some homemade compost which I mixed together. We try to recycle all old leaves and vegetation from the garden in our compost heaps. As the leaves fall off the trees in the autumn we collect them and pile them up to make the leaf mould. I know the Reception children love throwing and kicking the leaves on the village green.

I have also been picking the apples and pears from the fruit trees in the orchard recently. The pears are quite firm, but are ready to eat within a few days of picking them. The apples can be stored in the garage, by wrapping each one in a piece of newspaper so that they do not touch each other and placing them in boxes. They make lovely puddings during the winter.

Thank you for coming to church to celebrate Harvest Festival last Friday. I love this time of year when there are so many lovely vegetables and fruits that we can be thankful for. Love from Mrs Fulwood.
