
The Christmas Card Postbox is by the hall door for the children to post their cards to their friends in school.

### Sunnyside Garden

It was lovely to see some snow on the garden earlier in the week. Did you notice how it settles on some surfaces but not others? The soil turned from brown to white, but the grass remained green. I wonder why?

Then it was very windy and most of the leaves have been blown off the trees. When I looked out of the window I saw the leaves blowing horizontally across the garden and also blowing into piles against walls. Now I just have to go outside and finish sweeping them up.

A shrub that looks lovely this week is a very old hydrangea plant which grows near the house. The flowers are turning from bright pink to dusky pink/green as the cold weather causes them to change. The shrub is probably nearly 100 years old as I think it will have been planted soon after the house was built in 1911.

Another shrub that is only 40 years old is the garrya elliptica that we planted against the kitchen wall soon after the kitchen was built in 1980. It has lovely long catkins which grow during the winter months. Our cats like to climb up it and sit on the window sill upstairs
