Sunnyside Garden

This week two types of little flowers have appeared in the garden. First the snowdrops are beginning to appear in the grass and in flower borders. They just keep appearing each year, with ever increasing numbers. They are such pretty little flowers with their white petals and green markings. Have you seen them in the church yard?

The other flowers are called aconites and grow in small clusters under the rose arch as well as at the edge of the orchard. For many years we only ever had 3 flowers from one plant. Then I cleared the soil around the plant very carefully and ever since more plants and flowers have appeared each year. If you want to see a carpet of aconites they pop up every Spring, under the trees near the double gate entrance to Alford Manor House.

I have been watching the flower seeds that I planted as you went back to school last September. They have been in the cold frame all winter and seem to be growing well. They are protected by the sides of the frame from cold weather and wind. I will be able to plant them in the garden in a couple of months time.
