Y3 and Y4 School Visits

Lincoln Cathedral and The Earth Exhibition at The Collection.

On Friday 29th April 2022 Year 3 and 4 will be visiting The Collection at Lincoln to see the exhibition of the Earth and will also be looking at their Egyptian Artefacts. After this the children will be walking up to The Cathedral to have a look around.

The children will be leaving school by coach at 9:15am and will need to wear their school uniform, sensible shoes and a waterproof coat. They also require a packed lunch and plenty to drink. What have we been learning this week (according to our school members of parliament).

Year 1

In Year 1 they have been learning their numbers to 50. In English they have been rhyming words like boat and goat and in Science they have explored shiny and dull materials.

Year 2

Sunnyside Garden

This week I have been checking on the flower seeds that I planted last September and which have been in the greenhouse or cold frame all winter. Most of them have continued to grow despite only occasional watering. I have started to remove them from their seed trays, trim their roots and untidy growth and replant them in slightly larger modules. With more sunlight, regular watering and warmer days they will grow quickly now. You can see pictures of my cornflower plants before and after replanting.

The Reception class planted daffodil bulbs in three tubs last autumn. They are now flowering beautifully and look so colourful in the garden.

The onions are continuing to produce shoots, so they will need planting outside soon. I need to cover a planting area with fleece to warm up the soil before planting them out.

I am planting seeds each week. This week I have sown two types of tomatoes, cosmos, salvia, rudbeckia and aster seeds. The pots of seeds are in the heated tray until small seedlings appear and then I put them in the greenhouse. The heated tray just helps them to germinate, but they would get too tall and weak if I left them in the propagator too long. If you want to plant seeds at home, cover each pot with a plastic bag and put them on a window sill near a radiator and they should germinate quickly. Only plant the number of seeds you need to turn into plants. Keep the remaining seeds for next year.

We are delighted to announce that we will be running HAF camps during the Easter holidays across the seven venues shown in the table below. The HAF camps provide eligible pupils with the opportunity to attend holiday provision during the Easter Holidays FREE OF CHARGE. The fun-filled days will have a variety of options to suit all children, including multi sport activities, arts and crafts, Lego building, Laser Tag, and much more.
