





Sunnyside Garden



Have you seen trees covered in pink and white blossom during the past couple of weeks. There are some lovely trees in gardens and street corners such as near the library in Alford. The blossom will blow off the trees and later in the year the trees will have lots of fruits. Some fruits are small and inedible, whilst other trees produce crops of cherries, pears or apples. If you look closely at the apple blossom, pink buds open to produce paler pink flowers.



The bluebells are now flowering in the orchard, giving pretty clumps of blue flowers. We leave these to die back gradually, like the daffodils and will mow them in about 6 weeks time. This way the number of flowers increases naturally.

The rhubarb is now growing very quickly and this is the best time of year to pick it and have rhubarb crumble for pudding. The stalks are young and easy to prepare. They are best picked straight from the garden, cooked and eaten within an hour.



Have a look in your garden or around the school grounds where you will see lots of young plants growing and the trees unfurling their leaves. You could be plant observers this week.

Cooking together can be a great way to spend time together and learn new skills, especially when it involves chocolate! Baking at home can be hugely satisfying and tasty too! Here is a great way to use and share your left over Easter

Chocolate.

Lumpy Bumpy Cookies

Makes 16 cookies

Ingredients


- 75g butter
- 75g soft brown sugar
- 1 egg
- A cap full of vanilla essence
- 150g of self-raising flour
- 100g of your favourite chocolate, (Chopped into small chips and chunks).

Method

- 1. Preheat the oven to Gas Mark 4/180 degrees.
- 2. Line a baking tray with a baking sheet.
- 3. Cream the butter and sugar together until combined.
- 4. Beat the egg with the essence in a jug with a fork.
- 5. Slowly add the egg mixture to the butter and sugar, beating until slightly fluffy.
- 6. Stir in the flour and chocolate until just combined, don't over mix.
- Use a teaspoon to spoon teaspoon sized dollops onto the prepared baking sheet.
 Allow some room for spreading. You may need 2 baking trays.
 (This mixture should make around 16 cookies).
- 8. Bake for 12 minutes and check, they may take up to 15 minutes.

The cookies are cooked when they have just started to brown up. They may feel a little soft but will firm up when cooling on the rack. If in doubt take out one cookie and break in half if it looks fluffy and not wet it is cooked. Cook them too long and they will be dry, cook them not enough and they will be raw, it's a challenge to get just the right amount of chew to the texture!
