Y3 and Y4 Visit Alford Craft Market Pottery and The Manor House.



Sunnyside Garden

The soil in the garden is very dry as we have not had much rain for ages. However the plants are continuing to grow and some are producing beautiful flowers. Each year the tree peony produces bright green leaves and lovely yellow flowers on woody stalks. The flowers only last for about two weeks each May, but remind me that summer is on its way.
