I'm the Mr Keaton your children have been pestering you about. I'm also to blame for the avalanche of artwork that's been filling up Mrs Belton's office since October when we launched the Creativity Award.

I don't think any of us realised how enthusiastically the students would take to the idea. I'm a writer, actor and teacher. In recent years it has greatly concerned me that the arts were losing their place on the syllabus. It worries me that young people will miss the pleasure of creating. The real buzz of making a meal, a scarf, a song, a dance, a story. It worries me that we might miss the child that will one day become the artist that inspires us.

Your children may have quoted my instructions. That nothing they do is wrong. To throw their work away. To do more. To do better. I know they found these exciting because we normally see the things we make as the end of a project but creativity is a process. If you love the process you'll want to make more. So for me, I don't judge the items the children make as much as find out what inspires them.

Over the year I have talked to every child in the school several times. I have engaged with them as one artist to another. That, I think, is the reason for their enthusiasm. Like all of us, they want to be heard. These conversations give me energy because children talk easily if you listen with respect.

I am hugely indebted to Mrs Belton and her staff and to Ross Hamilton who has been my partner in this venture. On Thursday 23rd of June, I'll be handing out 5 awards. A huge thank you to all the parents and guardians who supported their children this year. I hope you saw the difference that creativity can make for a young person. I hope they continue to do more and do better.

Cheese Straws

Cheese straws are quite easy to make and are so versatile. They are great for snacks, picnics or packed lunches. They can be dipped into hummus, cream cheese or tomato soup!

Instead of straws you could try using a cookie cutter to cut out different shapes and have savoury biscuits too.

You will need:

- 115g plain flour
- 1 teaspoon paprika
- 55g butter or margarine
- 75g grated cheese
- 1 egg

How to do it:

- Measure out the flour and paprika into a bowl and add the butter broken into small pieces.
- · Rub the flour and butter together to make a texture like breadcrumbs.
- Stir in the grated cheese.
- Stir in the egg and mix to combine all of the mixture together into dough.
- Roll out the dough to the thickness of your little finger and cut into strips as pictured.
- Bake in a preheated oven at 200 degrees Celsius for 10-15 minutes.
- Allow to cool on a wire rack.
