Sunnyside Garden

I have noticed during the past few weeks how the plants in the Reception class garden have been growing so quickly. The little greenhouse is protecting the tomato plants which have lots of small yellow flowers. I hope each of these turns into a tomato before the end of term.

The runner beans have lots of red flowers which will produce a lovely crop of beans. One of my favourite vegetables when picked fresh from the garden. The bean plants at Sunnyside are getting close to the top of their canes but there are not any flowers yet.

The strawberries are growing well. I love your containers fixed to the wooden pallet. What a good way of recycling a pallet.

The parsley is thriving and already beginning to form seed heads. I wonder if you collected and dried the seeds whether you could save them until next year. They may germinate and produce new plants next summer.

FUN, FOOD & FITNESS

For when you need an indulgent treat, this no bake, really easy Biscoff Cheesecake is rich and yummy! No heat or special equipment is required and this is so easy for all the family to get involved in.

The Base:

- 220g of Biscoff biscuits (Reserve a few crumbs for sprinkling later.)
- 60g butter/margarine (melted)

Cheesecake:

- 500g cream cheese
- 150g Biscoff spread
- 100g icing sugar

Topping:

- 200g melted Biscoff spread
- A sprinkle of biscuit crumbs

This recipe can be made in other dishes too! Try making individual portions in glasses, small bowls or ramekin dishes if you don't have a cake tin. The recipe is easily halved too, pictured here is half the recipe into 6 ramekin dishes.



Begin by lining the base and sides of an 8 inch circular cake tin. Crush the biscuits into crumbs and mix into the melted butter. Spread over the base of the cake tin and press firmly down.

Mix together in a bowl, the cream cheese and Biscoff spread and icing sugar. Tip the mixture onto the biscuit base and smooth the top. Pop it into the fridge for about 10 minutes.

Pour the melted Biscoff spread over the cream cheese mixture in the cake tin.

Gently tip the tin to allow the mixture to cover evenly. Chill in the fridge for at least 3 hours or overnight. Decorate the top with biscuit crumbs and more biscuits and enjoy!
