Heating Oil Payments

In March, the UK Government announced that it would provide targeted support for households reliant on heating oil who are facing financial hardship because of the increase in heating oil prices and, as a result, are at risk of losing immediate access to heating or hot water.

The funding is being provided to areas with high levels of households reliant on oil as a top-up to the previously announced [Crisis and Resilience Fund](#) (CRF) and on behalf of Lincolnshire County Council, will be administered locally by the Lincolnshire Community Foundation.

As a result, eligible households will receive a £300 prepaid off-grid energy voucher. If the household has no means of receiving an electronic voucher, alternative methods will be explored on a case-by-case basis.

To qualify, households must:

- Have a below average income (under £36,000 combined household income)
- Have savings of less than £6,000 after the cost of oil
- Not be on a mains gas supply and use heating oil as the primary fuel for heating and/or hot water
- Be at risk of losing immediate access to heating or hot water due to a lack of heating oil
- Be able to pay the difference between the voucher value (£300.00) and the full cost of the heating oil, including delivery

Applications are now being accepted via the [Crisis and Resilience Fund: Heating Oil Support Scheme – Lincolnshire Community Foundation](#) and are limited to one per household.

Applications will be processed as soon as possible, with an aim to determine eligibility for complete applications within 2 working days, subject to demand and the complexity of supporting evidence.

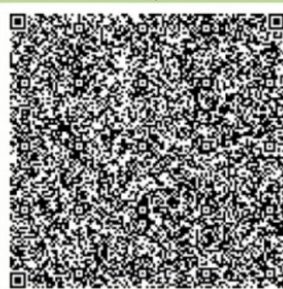

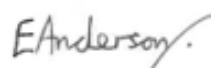
Dear Parents and Carers,

Household Funding Support

Household Support Funding

The government has confirmed that the Household Support Fund (HSF) will end after the 31 March 2026. There will be no further allocations of this funding through schools or early years providers. The HSF has previously been used to fund support for families eligible for free school meals, Early Years Pupil Premium and families eligible for Early Learning for Twos (for families in receipt of additional support). This has usually been in the form of a supermarket voucher, distributed by schools and early years providers to the families of all eligible children, most recently in June and in December. We would like to thank you all for all your support in distributing previous grants to vulnerable families.

Recently, the government announced that there will be a new Crisis and Resilience Fund (CRF) from April 2026, which will include an element of emergency support to eligible residents. This will be different from HSF, with a focus on helping people build longer-term stability and resilience and reducing reliance on short-term financial support.

The primary objectives of the CRF are to provide a safety net for those on low incomes who encounter a financial shock (a sudden unexpected expense or drop in income) and to invest in building financial resilience to reduce the need for crisis support in the long-term. The local eligibility criteria for a crisis payment are under development, but, in line with the guidance, will be based on individual need and circumstances.

Local councils have received detailed guidance from the government and are currently considering the best way to support Lincolnshire residents moving forward. Please note that these changes do not affect the government-funded Holiday Activities and Food programme (HAF) that provides free holiday clubs for reception to year 11 pupils in receipt of benefits-related free school meals in Lincolnshire over the summer, Christmas and Easter holidays. These words and actions mean something special. They are a prayer for our fellow Christians and the people we love. They are a prayer for peace in the church and in the world. They are a hope that we are 'at peace' with each other. What does the word 'Peace' mean to you?

ATTENDANCE

A national framework for Penalty Notices for school absences, including unauthorised leave of absences in Term Time, is in force at St Helena's CE Primary Academy.

If a pupil has 10 unauthorised sessions, which is equal to 5 school days within a 10 week period, a penalty notice may be issued.

This will come under 3 categories: First, Second and Third offence.

FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or unauthorised absences the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days, reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

SECOND OFFENCE

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave or unauthorised absences the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered.

THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FUTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time leave or unauthorised absences a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court.

Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a Parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.
