

Thank you, as always, for your continued support.





All entries should be clearly labelled with your name and the character you have created. There will be prizes for creativity, effort and likeness to the character — so let your imagination run wild!


Bringing in your potatoes:

St Helena's Safeguarding Update: Lockdown Procedures and Drills

At St Helena's, the safety and wellbeing of our children and staff is always our highest priority. As part of our ongoing commitment to safeguarding, we practise our fire drill at least three times each year so that everyone knows what to do in an emergency.

Over the past term, with the support of our staff team, governors and external safety advisers, we have also developed a clear lockdown procedure. This is a standard safeguarding measure used in schools to ensure we are fully prepared should we ever need to respond to an incident in or around the school site.

I am writing to inform you that next term we will be carrying out a lockdown drill. At the start of the term, staff will carefully and sensitively explain the process to the children so that they understand what to do and feel reassured.

We understand that this may sound daunting for parents; however, practising these procedures is a critical part of keeping everyone safe and ensuring that we are fully prepared should we ever need to implement a lockdown.

For safeguarding reasons, we are unable to share the full details of our lockdown procedure with the wider community. This is to ensure that our arrangements remain effective and secure, and that in the unlikely event of an incident, our procedures can be implemented swiftly and safely to protect everyone on site.

Please also be aware that, in the event of a lockdown at St Helena's, parents will not be notified until after the situation has concluded. This is to ensure that phone lines remain clear and that staff can focus fully on keeping the children safe.

Thank you, as always, for your continued support in helping us maintain a safe and secure environment for all members of our school community.

ATTENDANCE

A national framework for Penalty Notices for school absences, including unauthorised leave of absences in Term Time, is in force at St Helena's CE Primary Academy.

If a pupil has 10 unauthorised sessions, which is equal to 5 school days within a 10 week period, a penalty notice may be issued.

This will come under 3 categories: First, Second and Third offence.

FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time Leave or unauthorised absences the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child if paid within 28 days, reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

SECOND OFFENCE

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for Term Time leave or unauthorised absences the amount will be:

£160 per parent, per child to be paid within 28 days. No reduced rate will be offered.

THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FUTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for Term Time leave or unauthorised absences a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates Court.

Magistrates' fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a Parents future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.



My name is Martha, and I am Mum to Finn in year 4, and Morgan in year 2 (also to Casper our dog, and Randall our cat) and I'm really hoping that someone in our school's community can help us. **We live in a bus, and I have until the end of February to find somewhere for us to be.**

We used to live on the field that everyone planted trees on a couple of years ago. We have, for the last year been parked on my mechanics yard, in Woodhall. We now need to move because they want to build on where we are.

Does anyone have, or know anyone who has, a quiet spot where we can be? Do you have a yard we could tuck into a corner of? Ideally I could find somewhere where we can be for the next four years whilst the kids finish out at St Helena's, but if there are several places we could move between that would also give us some stability.

I am not naturally nomadic, and we moved onto the bus simply because it was all I could afford when our marriage broke down. Having to keep finding new places to be is affecting all of us, because we are all of the neurospicy variety and change is very disregulating. Uncertain change even more so.

Year 5 and 6 visit the Natural History Museum in London

We are delighted to inform you that, in a St Helena's first, children in **Year 5 and Year 6** will be visiting the **Natural History Museum in London on Thursday 26th March 2026**.

The purpose of this visit is to provide cultural enrichment and to complement our Upper Key Stage 2 science curriculum. During the day, the children will enjoy a guided tour of the museum and explore some of its most iconic exhibits. In addition, they will take part in an engaging, hands-on workshop focused on evolution, one of their science topics this year, using real-life fossils.

Due to the distance of travel, this visit will involve an **early departure and a late return**. We will be leaving school at **5:15am**, so children must arrive at school by **5am at the latest**, having already eaten breakfast. All children will need to bring a **packed lunch**, a **full water bottle**, and an **additional packed tea and drink** for the journey home. We aim to depart the museum at **3pm** with an estimated return time to school of **8pm**. We will keep families informed on the day should there be any delays to our return.

Due to the timings of the visit, we fully appreciate children may be tired for school the following day. Therefore, it has been agreed that children can have the option of a staggered start on Friday 27th March, arriving no later than **10am**, to ensure they can attend the school day properly rested.

To support this exciting opportunity and experience, we kindly request a voluntary contribution of **£31.40** per child, which will go towards transport and workshop costs. Payments can be made via Parentmail or by Credit/Debit Card at the school office.

Please ensure your Consent/Medical form has been returned to school prior to the 26th March - Thank you.

Current Year 3 - Rand Farm Park Residential.

We are delighted to inform you that a fantastic opportunity has arisen for our current Year 3 children to take part in a residential visit to Rand Farm Park from Thursday 24th June **2027** to Friday 25th June **2027**.

This exciting visit will provide the children with hands-on learning experiences linked to their curriculum studies. Activities will include:

- Learning why farmers keep poultry
- Wood shearing and spinning
- Understanding the importance of bees
- Discovering where eggs come from
- Exploring whether foods are fruits or vegetables
- Bottle-feeding lambs and calves
- Making their own pizza

The children will leave school during the normal school day on Thursday and will return by the end of the usual school day on Friday.

Further details, including a kit list and consent/medical forms, will be provided closer to the visit.

The total cost of the visit is £168.30, and we are offering the following payment plan:

- £45 deposit due by Wednesday 4th March 2026
- £45 due by 4th June 2026
- £45 due by 4th March 2027
- Final payment of £33.30 due by 4th May 2027

Payments can be made via Parentmail or by credit/debit card at the school office.

School Association have kindly agreed to paying for the transport.
